

Spotlight 4 - Stakeholder Engagement – Virtual vs. In-Person Meetings: Pros and Cons



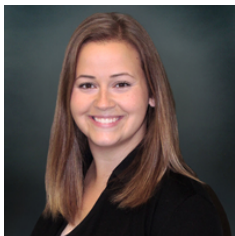
